4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures general: In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical

attention.

First-aid measures after inhalation: Move exposed person to fresh air. Keep person warm and rest. If

not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. It may be dangerous for the person providing aid to give mouth-to mouth resuscitation. Get medical attention if adverse health effects persist or are severe. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband. In case of inhalation of decomposition products in a fire, symptoms may be



delayed. The exposed person may need to be kept under medical

surveillance for 48 hours.

First-aid measures after skin contact: CONTACT WITH THE HOT MELT: Cooling immediately with plenty

of water. Do not remove product crusts which may have formed neither forcibly nor by applying any solvents to the skin involved. To obtain medical care for possible burns and for a smooth cleansing of the skin, seek medical advice immediately.

First-aid measures after eye contact: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water, occasionally lifting the

upper and lower eyelids. Check for and remove any contact lenses. Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes. Get medical

attention if irritation occurs.

First-aid measures after ingestion: Wash out mouth with water. Move exposed person to fresh air.

Keep person warm and rest. If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Stop if the exposed person feels sick as vomiting may be dangerous. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs. Get medical attention if adverse health effects persist or are severe. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open
